**Bluecoat Wollaton Academy    Bluecoat Aspley Academy    Bluecoat Primary Academy**

An exciting missional opportunity has arisen within your community. The Diocese is currently looking to recruit Diocesan representative governors to serve on the 3 Local Governing bodies of the church academies within the Archway Learning Trust. This comes about because Bluecoat has divided into three separate academies.

The Church of England is committed to a vision for education which is all about the flourishing of young people through wisdom, knowledge, skills, hope, aspiration, community, living well together, dignity and respect. A vision which aims to ensure that young people experience “life in all its fullness” John 10:10.

As a Diocesan governor you would be required to attend 5 full Local Governing Body meetings per year and perhaps contribute to a working group, on an occasional basis. You would also be invited to make visits and attend some activities and events in school. At both secondary academies meetings start at 5pm. At the Primary academy meetings start at 3.15pm. Meetings tend to be around two and half hours. The Diocese offers training for all new Diocesan governors.

Church academies need a broad spread of skills across the whole board and require people who have some of the following:

*Knowledge of how to develop the Christian ethos of the school and promote links with the local community and Church.*

*An ability to work in a professional manner as part of a team and take collective responsibility for decisions.*

*An ability to question, challenge and problem solve.*

*An ability to analyse data.*

*IT skills*

*Financial skills*

*Legal or business skills*

*health and safety*

*Experience of working with young people*

*Understanding of special educational needs.*

If you feel you have relevant skills to serve and contribute to this transformational vision then informal discussions are very welcome.
