Anointing with Oil and Prayer for Healing

Our future 10.00 a.m. Communion Services during the interregnum starting today Sunday the 29th June will include anointing with oil with prayer for healing alongside the two people administering the Bread and Wine.

The act of Anointing will be accompanied by this short prayer;

N, I anoint you in the name of God who gives you life.

Receive Christ's forgiveness, his healing, and his love.

May the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ

grant you the riches of his grace,

his wholeness and his peace. AMEN.

Anointing with Oil is frequently used in the Bible for setting people apart for their ministry like Kings and Priests and people being Ordained for Ministry. We find in the Gospels Jesus frequently laying hands on the sick and praying for healing. His disciples used oil when sent out by Jesus on their first Mission 'They anointed many sick people with oil and healed them.' Mark 6.13.

Anointing with oil was accepted as an outward sign of the healing grace of God in the early church and is frequently used today. James 5.14.

" Are any of you sick? You should call for the elders to pray over you, anointing you with oil in the name of the Lord. Such a prayer offered in faith will heal the sick, and the Lord will make you well."

It seems very appropriate in the context of Communion when we receive bread and wine and remember Christ body broken on the Cross and his blood poured out for our forgiveness to offer an anointing for healing and an empowering to serve Christ in our daily lives. The anointing is voluntary and if you don't wish to receive it you can just return to your place.

Can people be aware that there will be six people in front of the table and so there will be two people administering the Bread, two the wine and two on either side offering anointing. Please give your name to the persons doing the anointing. When a person administering the bread is waiting please go forward to receive. Please return to your place by using the side aisles.

Pray for people going forward to receive, that we may receive all the benefits of Christ passion. People who wish to ask for a blessing keep your hands by your side and the person administering the bread will know that you desire a blessing. The same with young children.
